CHARITY IN ACTION – CHRIST HOUSE

On the second Tuesday of every other month, the Knights of Columbus #4522 are blessed and pleased to serve dinner to the needy and homeless at Christ House in Alexandria. On Tuesday, March 14, 2017 nine of our Knights (and several wives) worked in unison to serve a hot meal of meatballs and gravy, rice and vegetables—along with fruit cocktail and cookies for dessert to over 35 Alexandrians in need. This regularly scheduled service to others has been going on for over 14 years under the watchful eye and direction of SK Dick Owen, PGK, PFN, FDD. During that time, SK Owen and his Knights have put in well over 2,000 hours of service cooking and serving at Christ House.

their rent, utility bills and prescription bills among many other services. Graciously, the Woman's Casey Club of Council 4522 supports the Christ House Mission with cookies on an ongoing and regular basis.

We send our prayers and condolences to the family of



APRIL – MERCY AND MEDITATION

From Pope Francis' Amoris Laetitia

Once we allow ill will to take root in our hearts, it leads to deep resentment. ... The opposite of resentment is forgiveness, which is rooted in a positive attitude that seeks to understand other people's weaknesses and to excuse them. As Jesus said, "Father, forgive them; for they know not what they do" (Lk 23:34). Yet we keep looking for more and more faults, imagining greater evils, presuming all kinds of bad intentions, and so resentment grows and deepens. ... Something is wrong when we see every problem as equally serious; in this way, we risk being unduly harsh with the failings of others. The just desire to see our rights respected turns into a thirst for vengeance rather than a reasoned defense of our dignity.

When we have been offended or let down, forgiveness is possible and desirable, but no one can say that it is easy. ... All this assumes that we ourselves have had the experience of being forgiven by God, justified by his grace and not by our own merits. We have known a love that is prior to any of our own efforts, a love that constantly opens doors, promotes and encourages. If we accept that God's love is unconditional, that the Father's love cannot be bought or sold, then we will become capable of showing boundless love and forgiving others even if they have wronged us. Otherwise, our family life will no longer be a place of understanding, support and encouragement, but rather one of constant tension and mutual criticism. THE STATIONS OF THE CROSS

During Lent, we remember Jesus' final day before crucifixion. The Stations of the Cross bring us closer to Christ as we meditate on the great love He showed for us in His most sorrowful Passion!

The Stations of the Cross themselves are usually represented in churches by a series of 14 pictures or sculptures covering our Lord's Passion. They are meant to be "stopping points" along the journey for prayer and meditation. Although there are variations on this list below, these 14 scenes are taken from St. Alphonsus Liguori's well-known setting of the Stations in prayers, his Way of the Cross.

- 1. Jesus is condemned to death
- 2. Jesus carries His cross
- Jesus falls for the first time under His cross
- 4. Jesus meets His sorrowful Mother
- 5. Simon of Cyrene helps Jesus to carry His cross
- 6. Veronica wipes the face of Jesus
- 7. Jesus falls for the second time
- 8. The women of Jerusalem weep over Jesus
- 9. Jesus falls for the third time
- 10. Jesus is stripped of His garments
- 11. Jesus is nailed to the cross
- 12. Jesus dies on the cross
- 13. Jesus is taken down from the cross
- 14. Jesus is laid in the Sepulcher (the Tomb).
