What is the Pilgrim Icon
Program (https://www.kofc.org/pilgrimicon)? Every few
years, the Knights of Columbus selects an icon of a
saint whose patronage is particularly inspiring to
Knights and their communities. Each jurisdiction
receives one or several of these icons which travel from
council to council and serve as the centerpieces for

prayer services in parishes throughout the Order. Since the first traveling pilgrim icon of Our Lady of Guadalupe in 1979, more than 174,800 council and parish prayer services with some 22 million participants have been held.

This year, Supreme Knight Patrick E. Kelly chose to entrust his service to St. Joseph, following Pope Francis' call for the intercession of St. Joseph especially for the Knights. This icon is a replica of the original hosted at the St. Joseph Oratory in Montreal, Canada. The original is written (prayerfully painted) by Elizabeth Bergeron, from a drawing by famed iconographer Alexandre Sobolev.

The Four Senses of Scripture

Last month, we examined how the Bible is far beyond a one-dimensional book. Very few of its verses reveal just one thing. Instead, it is layered in richness and meaning. These four dimensions of interpretation offer just one set of keys to help Catholics mine the hidden meaning of the Sacred Page.

THE LITERAL MEANING: The literal meaning of a verse asks: what is the meaning of past events as reported in the sacred text. Here we can think of something like the historical meaning. The literal meaning of a verse is more or less what happened (On a more technical note, some theologians like Aquinas think the literal meaning can be literary. This is how Aquinas allows for a literal meaning in poetic passages like the Psalms). John Cassian says the literal meaning, or narrative record, relays "things past and visible."

THE ALLEGORICAL MEANING: The allegorical meaning is sometimes called the Christological or typological meaning. The idea here is that events and symbols can refer to Christ. References to Jesus can even be found in the Old Testament. For example, when Moses places a golden serpent on a pole to cure the Israelites' snakebites (Numbers 21), Christians see it as a type for Christ who saves us from our sins on the cross. St. Paul himself offers us this method of interpreting the Bible, when he writes, "The rock was

Christ" in 1 Corinthians 10. St. Paul sees in the story of a rock offering water to quench the thirst of the Israelites in the desert Christ, who gives living water (John 7:37-39).

THE MORAL MEANING: The Bible, though, also offers us a way to live here and now. Some verses expound moral codes familiar to us all (such as the 10 Commandments in Exodus or the Beatitudes in Matthew 5). But many of Jesus' parables also have a moral. They instruct us on how to live. We can think too of the many words of wisdom of the prophets or of the advice given in books like Proverbs and Sirach. The Bible offers a guide to life, offering us real courses of action to carry out in our own day.

THE ANAGOGICAL MEANING: Anagogy is the interpretation of a word, phrase or text in a spiritual or mystical sense. Not only does the Bible relay past events, but it speaks to us of God's promises for the future. These future things are as real in the story of Christian salvation as past events: death, judgment, purgatory, heaven, or hell. Jesus reveals to us that the Kingdom of heaven will be like a wedding feast (among other images) and that he is the key to arriving there.

So what does this look like in practice? Let's consider Mark 1:16-20, which recounts Jesus "recruiting" Simon and Andrew, then James and John to be "fishers of men." The literal: Jesus walked along the shores of the sea and called Simon, Andrew, James and John to be apostles. The allegorical: By following Jesus and becoming apostles, they become fishers of men; that is men who announce the Gospel of Jesus. By saying "I will make you", Jesus reveals that his own person is the key to their vocation. The moral: We should, like the four apostles, listen to the voice of Jesus. We should obey the Lord's promptings without delay. We should not allow anything to be an obstacle to discipleship. The anagogical: Jesus calls us together. Just as the first disciples are not called alone, we shall be united in the Kingdom of Heaven. There Jesus will give us a new fraternity. We shall love as brothers and sisters, but the bond of charity that unites us will not be blood or family ties but will be the person of Christ himself.

VOTE - The time IS NOW

One of the most important things we can do to make the change in the world that God wants us to make is to vote! More than half of the people in the Church, do not vote in non-presidential years. Now that the 2022 midterm election season has begun, it's a good idea for each of us to make sure that we are registered to vote, and that our registration is up to date. And that is simple to do. The domain www.CheckYourVoterRegistration.com takes

you to the official site of the National Association of Secretaries of State, where you can look up your state and make sure you're ready for election day (both

primaries and general).

Sometimes our status must be updated, or we may have to reregister if there's been a change of



name, address, or party, or some other circumstance, including data error, affects our current voter registration status. If for some reason you are not registered, please be sure to do that right away. Again, there's a simple way to start the process online: www.Vote.gov. It's an official website of the government and will lead you to all the info you need.

While some think of all this as primarily "political," it is actually part of our moral duty to be good stewards of the freedoms God has given us, and to make sure that the manner in which political power is exercised, resources are distributed, and rights are protected is done in such a way that glorifies him and serves the needs of our brothers and sisters. In short, voting is actually part of loving God and neighbor.

And it's a big part of defending the unborn from abortion! Among other things, the Dobbs case on abortion that the Supreme Court is about to decide will likely recognize that state and federal lawmakers can protect the unborn before viability. So now we need to elect members of Congress and state legislators who are willing to do exactly that. The Supreme Court case will not achieve the goal on its own; we need the legislators to carry it to the finish line. And every vote will count.

To think that an entire presidential race, or the balance of power in Congress, can depend on you is really not out of the question. Remember, polling consistently shows that voters motivated by the abortion issue vote pro-life much more than they vote pro-abortion. In other words, it's a winning issue that has enough influence among our fellow citizens to change the outcome of elections!

Let's go forward with courage, clarity and confidence, as pro-life people who are committed to electing public servants who know the difference between serving the public and killing the public!
