Grand Knight's Message

Supreme and the State Councils have been hosting discussions on the impacts of COVID-19 on their assigned jurisdictions and the Order as a whole. A summary of some of the discussions are:



Degree Ceremonies:

- Details will soon be sent out regarding the ability for anyone with a submitted Form 100 or E-Member to view the online video of the new consolidated degree(s)
- Within the same time frame, an updated version of the degree will be available to be performed over WebEx/skype/zoom for interested new members

Awards:

- Any council close to receiving star council will most likely receive it
- State Deputy Award submissions are due by 1 April (*Council 4522 has met all requirements for the State Deputy Award and all required reports have been submitted*), majority of awards are expected to be given out at Org Meeting 11 July in Roanoke (Tentative)
- Columbian Awards will be given out to DDs at October Meeting as usual

Insurance:

- Dropping members will be much easier soon via a new process forthcoming from Supreme
- Annual insurance quotas are going away in favor of fraternal benefits night with 10 non knights present (being tested in several states with great success)

• General Agents are being told to address the Field Agent shortage ASAP

Meetings & Elections:

- Supreme is recommending using online meeting software/teleconference for upcoming business meetings, nominating committee, and officer elections
- Free software is available at the following sites that is relatively easy to use (Zoom, WebEx, Skype)
- State Convention and 4th Degree cancelled; 2 May will be a teleconference over one of the above systems to complete the work that needs to be done. 4th Degree Biennial Meeting notes will be sent in separate email

Most importantly, please take care of yourselves, family and each other! Remember to check on your neighbors and other brother Knights. The parish office is open to receive your phone calls also. I encourage you to follow the directions and guidelines outlined by the CDC, National, State and local authorities. We shall prevail.

The Life of Pope John Paul II (Continued)

In 1964, Polish Primate Wyszynski appointed Karol Wotyla the archbishop of Krakow with the approval of the communist government. Ever since the beginning of the 1960's the Polish government had made clear its desire for a second Polish Cardinal. Using typical communist "subtlety" in diplomacy, they were planning a divide and conquer strategy to split the Polish church. The decision to make Princes of the Church however fell exclusively to the Vatican with no need for consultation with the Polish communists.

The government simultaneously had their desires fulfilled and denied when in 1967, Pope Paul VI gave Karol Wotlya his red Cardinal's cap. The Polish government already knew that they had been duped after Wotyla's appointment as archbishop, so he would have been their last choice for a second Polish Cardinal. Wotyla and Primate Wyszynski ended up moving forward largely in unison, with Wotyla deferring to Wyszynski whenever possible. All this, despite the fact that Wyszynski once described Wotyla, perhaps dismissively, as "a poet".

After the beginning of the second Vatican Council, Pope Paul VI started new policy of dealing with the communist governments of the world, which could be roughly described as "saving what can be saved". The thought behind this diplomatic strategy was that the church could not prevail or administer to the flock without existing to administer the sacraments. This is precisely what happened in Czechoslovakia where the church was so antagonistic to the government, that after the 1968 Soviet invasion, they effectively ceased to exist.

This set the stage for diplomatic friction between Warsaw and Rome.

Hostess Peggy Puritano provided an outstanding Irish spread of scones, Irish Soda Bread and sweets in honor of St. Patrick's Feast day.


The members decided as a group to attend the Living Stations of the Cross provided by the school children at Queen of Apostles Church, April 7th at 1:30 PM *(cancelled)*
