Fr. Andrew Amaruma was our Council chaplain when he was Parochial Vicar at Queen of Apostles. He writes from Uganda, where he is chaplain with the Apostles of Jesus at the Adjumani General Hospital. The city of Adjumani is very near the border of South Sudan. The hospital receives Christian refugees fleeing Muslim persecution in that region. Fr. Andrew recently wrote to the Council on the anniversary of his Priestly Ordination....

His message to us:

"My 21st Years of Priestly Ordination Anniversary July 20, 2017"

This date takes me back to the memory of my priestly ordination in July 20, 1996. A joy filled moment for me, my relatives, friends, the Christians, benefactors, formatters and the Missionary Institute of the Apostles of Jesus. Join me in thanksgiving to God for these years of service in the Ministry of Priesthood; a call for my personal Sanctification and bringing others close to Christ that they found their callings and

vocation to serve in different Ministries in the Church. I am humbly confident that I have had my own satisfaction and also some challenges too that I endeavor with the Grace of God to overcome them and bear the crosses they also entail.

For those who have experience grace filled moments in my priestly service the glory and gratitude goes to God. Where things have not gone well in my Ministry both for me and the people of God I serve in the past we entrust all to the mercy of God. and In humility we entrust the future in the providence of God.

My sincere gratitude for the people who have supported, and continue to support me spiritually, by wise advise and with monetary aid; friends, confreres, benefactors and Superiors. INTO THE BREACH: An Excerpt To Think About

"And I sought for a man among them who should build up the wall and stand in the breach before me for the land..." EZEKIEL 22:30

A CALL TO BATTLE

I begin this letter with a clarion call and clear charge to you, my sons and brothers in Christ: Men, do not hesitate to engage in the battle that is raging around you, the battle that is wounding our children and families, the battle that is distorting the dignity of both women and men. This battle is often hidden, but the battle is real. It is primarily spiritual, but it is progressively killing the remaining Christian ethos in our society and culture, and even in our own homes.

The world is under attack by Satan, as our Lord said it would be (1 Peter 5:8-14). This battle is occurring in the Church herself, and the devastation is all too evident. Since AD 2000, 14 million Catholics have left the faith, parish religious education of children has dropped by 24%, Catholic school attendance has dropped by 19%, infant baptism has dropped by 28%, adult baptism has dropped by 31%, and sacramental Catholic marriages have dropped by 41%.1 *This is a serious breach, a gaping hole in Christ's battle lines.*

While the Diocese of Phoenix has fared better than these national statistics, the losses are staggering...

...As our fathers, brothers, uncles, sons and friends fall away from the Church, they fall deeper and deeper into sin, breaking their bonds with God and leaving them vulnerable to the fires of Hell. While we know that Christ welcomes back every repentant sinner, the truth is that large numbers of Catholic men are failing to keep the promises they made at their children's baptisms – promises to bring them to Christ and to raise them in the faith of the Church...
