The Creed: Second, Third and Fourth Articles

This month, we continue with the Creed and focus on the next three articles: "I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord. He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried."

In this quick summary we go through the entire earthly life of our Lord, while further affirming the most fundamental truths of the faith.

"I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord" quickly and succinctly affirms our belief, Christ's connection to God the father, and his place in our faith. In this phrase, as in so much of the faith, we make an unambiguous proclamation: belief in Jesus Christ. Not a half-hearted statement but a clear declaration of our belief in Him. The name "Jesus" means "God saves" in Hebrew, and "Christ" means "Anointed One." To paraphrase the Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC), "The Son of God" signifies that Jesus is the only Son of God - a unique and transcendent relationship. And that unique relationship asserts the title of "our Lord." As it says in the CCC, "...man should not submit his personal freedom in an absolute manner to any earthly power. but only to God the Father and the Lord Jesus Christ: Caesar is not 'the Lord."

The gospel of John starts with among the most beautiful words ever written in mankind's history: "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God. and the Word was God." This introduction to John's gospel ends with "And the Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us..." God became man when Jesus "was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary." This act of God assuming a human nature is what the Church calls "Incarnation." It can be hard to understand that God did not need to become man. Yet he did "in order to save us by reconciling us with God; so that we might know God's love; to be our model of holiness; and to make us partakers of the divine nature." Mary's virginity further underscores and demonstrates the uniqueness of Jesus' divinity. Giving birth to the new Adam, Mary as a vessel was as pure as that first man who walked the earth.

Christ's suffering and death as a sacrifice is a mystery hard to understand. How could it be that the Almighty – who had the power to raise the dead – could be put to trial, crucified, and put to death. That makes our faith so different from those of mythology. Our God did not come to Earth to rule like a Greek god. Instead, he was born in humility, becoming the "Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world." He shared his divine powers

of healing and forgiveness, while at the same time lived and died as a mortal. As the CCC says, "to the benefit of every man, Jesus Christ tasted death. It is truly the Son of God made man who died and was buried."

Men's Faith Fridays

As mentioned at our last meeting, our Worthy Chaplain Fr. Diaz is seeking to start a faith-focused speaker series open to all men at Queen of Apostles occurring every other month beginning in September. The goal is to bring men together for fellowship and faith. While we're at it, we might even recruit some new Knights! The series would alternate with a similar women's series.

The proposed dates are as follows: September 16, 2022 November 18, 2022 January 20, 2023 March 17, 2023 May 19, 2023 - Summer Break —

The proposed format is:

7:00 - 7:05: Welcome and Intentions

7:05 – 7:20: Divine Chaplet 7:20 – 8:00: Fellowship 8:00 – 8:30: Speaker

8:30 - 9:00: Q&A/Discussion

Fr. Diaz will line up a speaker (though we would certainly welcome suggestions!), and the Knights would organize the event. The Faith Director would subsequently collaborate with the speaker to explain the format and introduce him to the evening's point of contact (see below).

Volunteers - To make this happen, we will need volunteers to organize, set up and clean up on a rotating basis. This will include getting the food (Jimmy Johns!), getting refreshments, setting up chairs/tables in Hannan Hall and subsequent cleanup. A single point-of-contact (POC) will connect with the speaker shortly before the event (Faith Director will introduce), emcee the event (including introducing the speaker and moderating the Q&A/discussion), and lead a small volunteer team in setting up and cleaning up the event space.

A total of three Knights (including the POC) will be needed to help at each event. Those Knights can also be attendees.


A Final Challenge for the Month
