HOLIDAY SAFETY

Did you know that more people get hurt at home during the holidays than at any other time during the year? Follow these helpful tips to avoid becoming a statistic!

Decorating Safety

- ❖ Never use lighted candles near trees, curtains/drapes, or any potentially flammable item.
- ❖ When displaying a tree, cut off about two inches off the trunk and put the tree in a sturdy, water-holding stand. Keep the stand filled with water.
- ❖ Keep your tree away from fireplaces and radiators.
- ❖ Use indoor lights indoors (and outdoor lights only outdoors). Look for the UL label. Replace or repair any damaged light sets. Use no more than three light sets on any one extension cord. Do not run cords under rugs or across doorways.
- ❖ Turn off all lights on trees and decorations when you go to bed or leave the house. Unplug extension cords when not in use.

Ladder Safety

- ❖ Always use the proper step stool or ladder to reach high places. Don't stand on chairs, desks or other furniture.
- ❖ When using ladders outdoors, get down immediately if inclement weather begins.

Winter Vehicle Preparation

- ❖ Prepare your car for the winter by checking items such as the brakes, spark plugs, battery, and tires. Check your owner's manual for the recommended interval for a tune-up.
- ❖ Be prepared for emergency situations on the road by having a winter “survival kit” in the vehicle including items such as, a flashlight, batteries, reflective triangles, compass, first aid kit, exterior windshield cleaner, ice scraper, hat and gloves, and a tool kit.
- ❖ Don't drink and drive.
