Quarantine—a word we have heard much of during the past 10 months, has its origin in Catholic Lenten traditions. To find the origin, read on to the end of the article.

It has been a pleasure to serve you all filling in for our Worthy Grand Knight for most of the month of January. I am continually impressed and humbled by the great works done by the Catholic gentlemen of Council #4522.

February brings the first awakenings of the Spring season in this part of the world. This is reflected in the upcoming celebrations of St. Valentine's Day and Ash Wednesday. While the days do start to grow longer around Christmas the rebirth of Springtime and Easter remains a long way off. February presages the process of physical and spiritual rebirth culminating in mid-Spring. St. Valentine's Day celebrates the Romantic love that makes new life possible, and the Ash Wednesday is also the beginning of a journey to new life, but not the new life of a child, the new eternal life with God in heaven we celebrate at the Easter feast.

Both celebrations remind us of the journey of mankind. A child is not born immediately but grows and develops in his mother's womb. The joy of Easter is not celebrated without the sacrifice of Lent that starts in the cold dark of Winter.

In the early Church, around the 7th century, it was customary for followers who had committed serious "public" sins to make a public confession and undergo a temporary excommunication from the Church. These sinners would be required to live separate from the parish and their family for the forty days of Lent. The Latin word for "forty" is Quadragesima, the origin of the word quarantine. Obviously, the church has since modified confession and penance to focus on a personal relationship with God.

As we enter this February let us kindly remember our wives or significant others and say a hearty prayer of thanksgiving that we are not members of the 7th century Church.

New Regalia

In August 2017, Supreme unveiled the new Official Regalia Dress. Soon, it was announced the use of the old Regalia (cape & chapeau) would end on June 30, 2019, leaving the new Official Regalia

Dress as the only authorized regalia for our Color Corps activities. Sadly, many Sir Knights have been reluctant to purchase the new Official Regalia—for many different reasons. Unfortunately, this has left our Color Corps having difficulty in providing Honor Guards when needed.

Our Assembly, Fr. Malloy, #1894 is offering several incentives to encourage Sir Knights to purchase the new Official Regalia:

- \$100 rebate for the first 10 Sir Knights who purchase the new Regalia and agree to a few reasonable requirements (such as attending Assembly meetings, which is made easier right now with our Virtual Meetings! and participating in Color Corps activities).
- There are several "free" swords available and once they are gone, the Assembly will provide a \$150 rebate for the purchase of a new sword (which typically costs about \$150).

Sir Knights without the Official Regalia should give serious consideration to purchasing it. Consider the various events that you will be faced with in the future: the passing of a brother Knight or Sir Knight, the installation of a new Pastor, the dedication of a new church... just to name few. Christian Unity in a Period of Discord

On January 20, during his weekly audience, Pope Francis asked Catholics to show what the journey to unity looks like.

The devil "fosters division everywhere and in every way" by tempting people "with the weaknesses of our brothers and sisters. He is astute: He magnifies others' mistakes and defects, sows discord, provokes criticism and creates factions," the Pope said. People need to ask themselves how they live each day and whether "we nurture conflict or fight for greater unity with the tools that God has given us: prayer and love."

As the American public remains fragmented and divided during a deadly pandemic, it is important for Knights and other Christians to remain committed to good faith actions in our Church and community. In a society that is inundated with divisive messaging on social media, television, or the internet, it is easy to fall victim to emotional arguments that foster conflicts among otherwise like-minded and well-intentioned individuals.

As Catholics, we must remain committed to unity through our actions, thoughtful prayer, and faith in the Holy Spirit.

As the Pope said, "the solution to these divisions is not to oppose someone, because discord generates more discord. The true remedy begins by asking God for peace, reconciliation, unity."
