



Paradigm Shift in the Order

At the State Mid-Year Meeting last weekend, we were briefed on a significant change coming to the Order. Separate First, Second, and Third Degrees are no more. They, along with the "secrecy" surrounding them, have been exchanged for a single, Admission, Formation, and Knighthood Exemplification--that will be performed in front of family and friends--hopefully to include a Mass. The new ceremony (without a Mass) should take just over 30 minutes.

We suspect you may have immediate reservations and indeed questions. A video example of the new Exemplification is included below, along with a link to a Q&A to help address any concerns you may have.

As we heard from State Deputy Szerszynski and Bishop Emeritus Paul Loverde, change, however much some may dislike it, will come. Supreme Knight Carl Anderson discusses the need for change in detail in the video. Please view the video with an open mind and know THIS change is vital to the health of the Order moving forward.

The Life of St. Pope John Paul II

We have followed Karol Wotyla through his early years, the Nazi occupation, and subsequent communist party rule. We have followed him from childhood to become a young man, priest, philosopher, and eventually Auxiliary Bishop for the Archdiocese of Krakow. At this



point on his life, we approach the beginning of the Second Vatican Council. The Council was a watershed experience in his life and its' changes affected innumerable other Catholics.

An ecumenical council (also called a general council) is a gathering of all the Roman Catholic bishops of the entire world. There have only been twenty-one general councils in the history of the Church. Some of the councils were brief, and some lasted for years (the longest being 18 years), they all tackled major issues of the Church. The only common thread amongst all these councils is that all were surrounded by conflict and followed by controversy.

Pope John XXIII stunned the world by announcing the Second Vatican Council in January of 1959. The Church (and world) has just made it through WWII and was dealing with new philosophies questioning the need for God or religion in modern thinking. Wotyla himself had said to view the Council as a string of arguments between "conservatives" and "liberals" of the Church would be the wrong way to go about it. He said that the Council needed to be viewed first and foremost as the spiritual experience that it was and was meant to be. While much of our mass and personal interaction with the Church changed because of the implementation of the Second Vatican Council, we must remember that this was a spiritual exercise, and approach it as such as we continue to learn about Wotyla's role in the proceedings
