#### Membership Weekend is Jan 13th/14th

Here's something for you to keep in your pocket and reflect on as you look in the mirror—and remember, why, you, became a Knight. It's also an excellent example to give other Catholic gentlemen who may be entertaining a decision to become a Knight!

As Catholic men, it is sometimes easy to forget that Saint Joseph was very important to the birth and life of Jesus by being that loving husband to Mary and formative father to Him two millennia ago. The Almighty conceived His son, Jesus, within the Blessed Virgin Mary, so that Jesus could eventually grow up to minister to the masses and save all of us by dying on the cross; as a result, God and Mary are Jesus' parents.

For some, Joseph could be viewed as a mere historical bystander. However, through his dutiful service to God and willingness to serve as Jesus's foster father, he guided Jesus and Mary to safety by their fleeing from Herod to Egypt and eventually led them back to Nazareth. #### Did you know? More importantly, do you care?

Karl Frisch, a newly elected Fairfax County School Board member, took the oath of office with his hand on a stack of pornographic books. The books contain



stories and pictures of graphic sex including the book "Lawn Boy" in which a 10-year-old boy recalls his first sexual encounter with an adult male? Frisch will become the school board CHAIRMAN in January 2024.

This action is a deliberate slap in the face to parents in Virginia and around the country who have been protesting children having access to pornographic reading materials in their school libraries.

Fairfax County Public Schools continue to promote the indoctrination of students encouraging them to explore their sexual orientation and gender identity at increasingly ages. Teachers are even instructed to keep information about sexual or gender identity from students' parents. Anti-family activists in other counties in Virginia are also pushing their sexual orientation and gender identity agenda.

While radical School Board members are pledging their fidelity to keeping pornography in schools, academic tests scores continue to go down. Even when liberal school board members are in the majority, they do not have a mandate to indoctrinate our children. #### March for Life 2023 WITH EVERY WOMAN, FOR EVERY CHILD!

Even with the wonderful blessing of *Roe v. Wade* being overturned, which allows more freedom at the state level to enact pro-life laws, the necessary work to build a culture of life in the United States of America is not finished. Rather, it is focused differently.

Sadly, the number of abortions annually is still well over 900,000 each year, and that number is expected to decrease only by roughly 200,000 each year in a post-*Roe* America. Many national legislative battles loom, including even keeping longstanding Hyde protections, which limit government funding for abortion on annual appropriation bills. The Hyde Amendment has saved over 2 million lives and is arguably the most impactful pro-life policy in our nation's history, but now cannot be taken for granted. Last, our most important work is changing hearts and minds. The goal of the national March for Life is to not only change laws at the state and federal level, but to change the culture to ultimately make abortion unthinkable.

With the role of the states being more important, we are also growing a strong state march for life initiative quickly, however, we will continue to march every January at the national level until a culture of life is restored in the United States of America.

Jeanne Mancini, the president of the March for Life, discusses ways in which the movement can care for pregnant women, mothers, and children together. "We aren't saying that it's easy, but we are saying that it is right to choose life and we hold that choosing life is empowering and that love saves lives."

Mancini said there is a "false narrative around abortion" that suggests abortion is "empowering and necessary." She said this "fear-based messaging tries to convince women who are facing unexpected pregnancies that they're alone, that they're incapable, that they are ill-equipped to handle motherhood."

Rather, Mancini emphasized that "women deserve to know all of their options," such as "the love, compassion and free resources that are available to them through the vast pro-life safety net." The pro-life movement, she said, supports women "before, during and after pregnancy."

For our part, we need at least three volunteers to help marshal the March for Life parade downtown. Having enough marshals is important to having a safe event. In the last several years authorities have added manpower requirements for first aid, cleanup, marshaling, and keeping Marchers from engaging with counter-protesters. Virginia Knights have marshaled the national March for Life for over 50 years, be a part of our history by signing up to marshal on January 19, 2024. Meet in D.C. at 9:00 AM and finish around 3:30 PM. Be one of the 100 marshals to help this year!

#### A Note From Our Lecturer

Sometimes we get confused - Last week, on the 8<sup>th</sup> of December we celebrated the Holy Day of Obligation celebrating Mary's Immaculate Conception. The confusion is whether this was Mary's Conception or our Lord's. The correct answer is Mary's Conception by her parents Joakim and Anne. Mary's Immaculate Conception is an important part of our Churches dogmas regarding Mary,

- She was conceived without sin.
- She was the Mother of God.
- She was a perpetual virgin.
- She was assumed into heaven.

Sometimes we get confused about Advent. Advent is where we prepare for Jesus' coming. What does that mean? We are:

- Awaiting to celebrate his first coming (Christmas).
- Awaiting his second coming.
- Awaiting another coming upon our own deaths.

As we overstress ourselves buying presents, sending cards, decorating our homes, are we focused on our own preparations for the true meaning of the Christmas Season approaching? If you knew you were going to die on December 25<sup>th</sup>, would your preparation be different? I know mine would be different.

To help you, my brothers, let's focus on really celebrating Advent. Please close your eyes and do this exercise with me.

- Think about everything you are thankful for. Then silently, thank God for these things.
- Who in your family, or friends are you angry with? Then silently, forgive them by name to the Lord.
- Is the stress of the season creating anxiety or impatience? Ask God to help you focus on the things that are truly important.
- Let us silently pray for our Holy Father, Our Bishop, and our Pastor and Parochial Vicar.

Thank God for them and their leadership. Pray for their ministries and good health.

- When you return home tonight take your spouse aside and tell them how much you love and appreciate them. Do this for your children as well.
- If you're truly brave and do not already do this, begin a family Rosary throughout the remainder of the Advent Season.
- Privately, ponder how you would live, and behave if you knew you were going to see the Lord vis-à-vis your death on December 25<sup>th</sup>.
