### March for Life 2026, Friday, January 23 National Mall, Washington, DC

The theme for this year is *LIFE IS A GIFT*!

Even with the wonderful blessing of *Roe v. Wade* being overturned, which allows more freedom at the state level to enact pro-life laws, the necessary work to build a culture of life in the United States of America is not finished. Rather, it is focused differently. Sadly, the number of abortions annually is still well over 900,000 each year, and that number is expected to decrease only by roughly 200,000 each year in a post-*Roe* America. Many national legislative battles loom,

including even keeping longstanding Hyde protections, which limit government funding for abortion on annual appropriation bills. The Hyde Amendment has saved over 2 million lives and is arguably the most impactful pro-life policy in our nation's history but now cannot be taken for granted. Last, our most important work is changing hearts and minds. The goal of the national March for Life is to not only change laws at the state and federal level, but to change the culture to ultimately make abortion unthinkable.

With the role of the states being more important, we are also growing a strong state march for life initiative quickly, however, we will continue to march every January at the national level until a culture of life is restored in the United States of America.

For our part, we need at least three volunteers to help marshal the March for Life parade downtown. Having enough marshals is important to having a safe event. In the last several years authorities have added manpower requirements for first aid, clean-up, marshaling, and keeping Marchers from engaging with counterprotesters. Virginia Knights have marshaled the national March for Life for over 50 years, be a part of our history by signing up to marshal on January 23, 2026. #### **Lecturer's Offering**

To Jesus through Mary

Always go to Jesus through Mary, but not for fear of Jesus. Often in books of piety, Jesus is presented as a judge and Mary as the merciful Mother. Yet it is not like that at all, because if Mary has a merciful heart, a heart of ineffable tenderness, it is Jesus who gave it to her....

In the same way that he himself came through Mary, he wants us to go to him through Mary. It is the surest way, the most direct way.... Let it be Mary who presents him all our gifts, and above all the gift of ourselves....

The Holy Spirit in us often works by attraction. What attraction I feel toward Mary—the attraction of a child for his mother! Happily, fervently, lovingly I hide myself under her mantle, I nestle in her arms, on her heart,

blending my love with the love of the Father, her Father, for her; with the love of Jesus, her Son, for her; with the love of the Holy Spirit, her Spouse, for her. Everything is tenderness, gentleness, mercy; everything is shared; everything is love. No, it is not in fear of God that I go to Mary, but in love for him, and at the same time in love for her, in order to share everything with them.

Each morning at Mass, the focal point of your days and of your life, put Jesus on the altar of the wounded heart of Mary, the Mother of the Church. Assist at Mass near her, with her, at the foot of the cross, like Saint John and Saint Mary Magdalene. Love to recite the Rosary, meditating on its mysteries. Little Thérèse said that each Hail Mary goes up toward heaven like incense whose smoking spirals are all alike, although it is always new incense which burns.

Love always says the same things, yet never repeats itself. I have told you, in speaking about Communion, that your heart is a heaven for Jesus, and this is even more so when Jesus finds Mary there. It is her heart which will reveal to you the intimate secrets of the heart of Jesus, as it is the heart of Jesus which will reveal to you the heart of Mary.


