Men on a Mission by Joseph McInerney Special Reprint in Celebration of Father's Day



Suppose you had a choice: your dream car with all the options and a summer home on the shore, or a life of daily toil spent with persons you truly love and who truly love you. Which would you choose? Think twice.

The answer lies in what really makes you happy. If there is

more to happiness and fulfillment than material comfort, where can we turn to find the truth about these things? While there is always a limit to the number of things you can accumulate, or cars you can fit on your driveway, there is no limit to the amount of happiness a human heart can receive – or give. The same is true for love.

Ultimately, the human heart reaches out to the infinite and eternal love of God. The Second Vatican Council tells us that we should look to Jesus Christ to find the meaning of human fulfillment. "Christ...in the very revelation of the mystery of the Father and of his love, fully reveals man to himself and brings to light his very high calling" (*Gaudium et Spes*, 22).

Mission: Redemption

Christ's role on earth can be depicted in terms of a mission. God the Father sends his only begotten Son into the world to reconcile it to himself. In other words, the mission of Jesus is nothing less than to save the souls of all people from all time. Christ achieves this

mission through his roles as priest, prophet, and king. As the perfect priest, Christ offers himself as the perfect sacrifice for the salvation of all humanity. As a prophet, he bears God's message of reconciliation to the world, teaching about God's love and mercy. As king, he rules the universe, exercising his authority through service and humility.

The mission of the modern-day father, like that of Christ, is the salvation of souls. The difference between them is the fact that Christ's mission is universal, concerned with the salvation of all mankind. The father's mission is concerned primarily with the salvation of his own family. Despite the difference in scope, the father has the same methods at his disposal to achieve this mission of salvation.

Through his share in Christ's grace in the sacraments of Baptism and Matrimony, a father shares the grace of Christ's death and resurrection with his children. He is also a priest in the sense that he brings his children to the sacraments, giving them a direct share in the grace of Christ. The father is a prophet – the bearer of God's message – to his children by fulfilling his obligation to teach them the Catholic faith.

Lastly, he performs Christ's kingly function as the spiritual head of his family. This headship is always exercised in a Christian manner, rather than a worldly manner. A father's obligation to lead his family in holiness is not a call to domination, but to service.

A Father's Fulfillment

Each week at Mass when reciting the Gloria, we learn that Christ alone is the holy one. In living out the vocation of fatherhood, a man is called to imitate the holiness that led Christ to give his entire self for the love of his brothers and sisters. At its root, then, fatherhood is a call to holiness. The example of Christ shows that holiness consists in the radical gift of oneself for the sake of others.

Fatherhood is the mission that allows a man to give of himself unreservedly. Thus, it is through fatherhood that most men will find their greatest happiness. To avoid fatherhood for the sake of that dream car, or that special summer home, is to cheat yourself out of one of life's most rewarding experiences. By calling men to make a gift of themselves to others, God calls fathers to a life of remarkable holiness, indescribable happiness, and true fulfillment. Don't Forget to Fly Your Flag!

Flag Day is celebrated on June 14. It commemorates the adoption of the flag of the United States on June 14, 1777 by resolution of the Second Continental Congress. The United States Army also celebrates its' birthday on this date. In 1916, President Woodrow

Wilson issued а proclamation that officially established June 14 as Flag Day; in August 1946, National Flag Dav was established by an Act of Congress, although it is not an official federal holidav.

The Life of St. John Paul II

The late 1970's were a turbulent time for the leadership of the Roman Catholic Church. It was typified by the "September Papacy" of Pope John Paul I. Albino Luciani (John Paul I) was only the pope from the end of August 1978 until the end of September of that same year. When elected, the leadership of the church was probably hoping for a steady hand to guide the church through the implementation of the recent Vatican II reforms. This was not meant to be however, and Karol Wojtyla was elected pope on just the fourth ballot of the conclave in October of 1978.

Karol Wojtyla often referred to himself a successor to St. Stanislaw, and now he proceeded from the See of St. Stanislaw (Krakow) to the See of St. Peter (Rome). St. Stanislaw holds a place of great importance to Polish Catholics as he did to Wojtyla himself.

St. Stanislaw was appointed as the Bishop of Krakow in 1072. During his tenure, he had a fierce disagreement with king Boleslaw, this eventually ended with the king's excommunication from the church. Angry at this action the king eventually had the Bishop killed while he said mass, and had his body quartered. Legend has it that his body was miraculously reintegrated, and it lies today in a sarcophagus in the Wawel Cathedral in Krakow.

The themes of speaking religious truth to political power resonated throughout Wojtyla's time in Poland, and of course will continue into his life as pope. Furthermore, the reintegration theme was almost certainly not lost on

him and the remainder of Polish Catholicism for a country that had been so badly divided in every sense of the word for the greater part of the last century.

Pro-Life Update

Now that the Alexandria Women's Abortion Clinic has moved to the 4th floor of 5999 Stevenson Avenue, prolife advocates have been reaching more women than ever before—praying on the sidewalk and connecting women, who are interested, to helpful resources while respecting social distancing.

Many Pregnancy Health Centers (PHC) have had to temporarily close during the COVID-19 pandemic. 24-Hour Hotline counsellors have been frustrated when not able to connect a woman to a local PHC in their area who can offer immediate help. Sidewalk Counselors also didn't feel confident they could connect women to resources that were open. As the angst rose, amazing women stepped up—the very directors of the PHC or Programs that deliver services. We recognize:

The Director of the Office of Family Life and Respect Life for the Diocese of Arlington, along with the Directors of the individual programs that provide essential support to women during pregnancy and healing after abortion; Director of the Assist Pregnancy Center; and the Director of the Pregnancy Ultrasound in Fairfax.

All these amazing women, Therese, Amy, Sarah, Jo, Maria, and LeeAnna have sacrificed their personal time by allowing their personal cell phone number to be accessed should a woman facing a challenging pregnancy need immediate assistance. This has enabled the sidewalk counselors to be confident that they can truly help a woman explore options and get the help they need by women who run these wonderful programs. We need to bring women to them so they can help them! Here is some of what we can offer even when most PHCs are closed:


The Alexandria Women's Clinic is losing clientele because there are sidewalk angels praying for these women. The Clinic is getting desperate having called the Police on several occasions only to be told the counselors are doing nothing illegal. They practice social distancing and do not harass anyone. If a woman is not interested in receiving information (or taking a picture of our brochure) they immediately turn away. There have been so many appreciative women who have thanked us for receiving information about free sonograms, counseling options and post-abortion care, all of which are not provided by the Clinic.

The busiest days are Tuesday, Thursday, Friday, and Saturday mornings. Please consider coming out and safely standing in support of women facing a difficult situation. Show them that you care. Pray for them so they can have the courage to reach out and get connected to people who genuinely want to help them make their situation better...not worse. It is essential that there are at least two people on the sidewalk in case a woman wants to talk with a sidewalk counselor.

And if you are not able to physically be present on the sidewalk, consider coming to Park & Pray! Your prayers are needed so that the right message is spoken by the sidewalk counselor to give a woman back her hope or start the healing after an abortion.
