RIGHT FOR LIFE MARCH IN JANUARY

The Right to Life March was held on January 27, 2017 (too late for the February Newsletter). Both PGK Carroll Glass and PGK Joseph Lynem were Marshals for the event and Brother Larry Cirignano coordinated the marchers from Queen of Apostles. Brother Vincent also participated. This year's theme was "The Power of One," meaning that if each of us raise our voice, the power of one becomes the power of many—and with many voices, we will have our voices heard to eliminate the horrible tragedy of abortion.

Just to recount a bit of the day's activities - The event has taken place every January since 1974, on or near the anniversary of Roe v. Wade, the 1973 U.S. Supreme Court decision that legalized abortion throughout the nation. Vice President Mike Pence spoke to hundreds of thousands, including members of the Knights of Columbus, saying, "I am deeply humbled to be the first vice president of the United States ever to attend this event." On behalf of President Trump, he also thanked the attendees for their stand for life and their compassion for the women and children of America.

This year, as in past years, the crowd at the March for Life consisted of people of all faiths and political backgrounds. Countless pro-life banners and flags were on display, including the thousands of Knights of Columbus "Defend Life" and "Choose Life" signs distributed by the D.C. State Council. Many participants attended with their families and young children. Others, such as college and high school

students, traveled together on parish- or school sponsored buses.

Following the rally, the nearly 2-mile march, approximately half a million strong according to EWTN reporters at the event, began from the National Mall and progressed past the U.S. Capitol before concluding at the Supreme Court building. Standing together, marchers once more defended the weakest in society. It is a cause that has endured both weather and time as people continue to make a stand — or in this case, a march — for life.

GOD'S CORNER

Unfailing prayer to St. Anthony

"Blessed be God in His Angels and in His Saints"

O Holy St. Anthony, gentlest of Saints, your love for God and Charity for His creatures, made you worthy, when on earth, to possess miraculous powers. Encouraged by this thought, I implore you to obtain for me (request). O gentle and loving St. Anthony, whose heart was ever full of human sympathy, whisper my petition into the ears of the sweet Infant Jesus, who

loved to be folded in your arms; and the gratitude of my heart will ever be yours. Amen.

THE STATIONS OF THE CROSS

Could you walk a mile in Jesus's shoes? The Stations of the Cross bring us closer to Christ as we meditate on the great love He showed for us in His most sorrowful Passion!

You can pray the Stations of the Cross (also known as the Way of the Cross) alone at anytime, but people most often pray them in a group setting Friday nights during Lent.

Tradition traces this loving tribute to our Lord back to the Blessed Mother's retracing her son's last steps along what became known as the Via Dolorosa (the Sorrowful Way) on His way to His Crucifixion at Calvary in Jerusalem.

Pilgrims to the Holy Land commemorated Christ's Passion in a similar manner as early as the 4th century A.D. The Stations of the Cross developed as a devotion in earnest, however, around the 13th to 14th centuries.

It became a way of allowing those who could not make the long, expensive, arduous journey to Jerusalem to make a pilgrimage in prayer, at least, in their church! Although the original number of stations varied greatly, they became fixed at 14 in the 18th century.

The Stations of the Cross themselves are usually represented in churches by a series of 14 pictures or sculptures covering our Lord's Passion. They are meant to be "stopping points" along the journey for prayer and meditation. Although there are variations on this list below, these 14 scenes are taken from St. Alphonsus Liguori's well-known setting of the Stations in prayers, his Way of the Cross.

- 1. Jesus is condemned to death
- Jesus carries His cross
- 3. Jesus falls for the first time under His cross
- 4. Jesus meets His sorrowful Mother
- 5. Simon of Cyrene helps Jesus to carry His cross
- 6. Veronica wipes the face of Jesus

- 7. Jesus falls for the second time
- 8. The women of Jerusalem weep over Jesus
- 9. Jesus falls for the third time
- 10. Jesus is stripped of His garments
- 11. Jesus is nailed to the cross
- 12. Jesus dies on the cross
- 13. Jesus is taken down from the cross
- 14. Jesus is laid in the Sepulcher (the Tomb).

In between each Station, in addition to saying the Our Father, Hail Mary, and Glory Be, congregations often sing verses from Stabat Mater, a moving hymn about the Blessed Mother's sorrow at her son's Passion.
