40 CANS FOR 40 DAYS

Pope John Paul II Council 4522 has partnered with Queen of Apostles Catholic School to initiate the First Annual 40 Cans for 40 Days Campaign at the school. The Campaign will provide the children and their families blessings each day during Lent—providing them with the opportunity to give alms, promote charity to others, and learn/know more about sacrifice in the way of bringing a canned good to school each day.

The Campaign began on Ash Wednesday and will run through Holy Thursday. Each school day during the Campaign, each student will bring ONE can of food (or non-perishable item) to school and place it in specially designated boxes in the gym. At the end of the Campaign, we will tally the results (most weight donated—prorated by class size). Everyone wins!

The proceeds will be split between ACCA and the Poor Sisters of St. Joseph food banks and the winning

classes will decide between a "dress down day" or a pizza lunch!

SEMINARIANS

The approved budget for the fraternal year included a \$2,000 donation (expense) to support Arlington Diocese Seminarians. Due to the dedicated efforts of Brother Tobias Amadi, PGK Al Avellino, and our WFS Vincent Apostolico during the "Keep Christ in Christmas" campaigns, the Council raised more than the \$2,000 needed to meet the need.

At the February Business Meeting, the Council approved \$500 in support to the following deserving Seminarians: Mr. Guillermo Gonzalez (studying in Madrid); Mr. Edouard Guilloux (studying at the Pontifical North American College in Rome); Mr. Jonathan Smith (studying at St. Charles Borromeo Seminary); and Mr. Tony Bennett (studying at Mount St. Mary's Seminary). The news gets better.

Supreme reimburses Pope John Paul II Council \$100 for every \$500 of support provided to seminarians. Thus, with the \$400 anticipated additional "income," the Council approved an additional \$500 in support Brother Knight, Brian Vaccaro!

Congratulations to all of the seminarians and a special "thank you" to our Knights that made it happen!!

For many of us, the Sacrament of Reconciliation can be stressful. We may be nervous or consider ourselves unforgivable. Yet, with confidence, Pope Francis reminds us: "Don't be afraid; go to Him; He is waiting for you. He will take care of everything. We hear many offers from the world around us, but let us take up God's offer instead: His is a caress of love." Visit http://thelightison.org/ for more information.

Toward a Missionary Family: <u>March Topic</u> – Lent - A Mission of Joy

Joy is probably the most powerful tool for evangelization. The joy of the gospel, as Pope Francis says, "fills the hearts and lives of all who encounter Jesus" and "...is one of the greatest gifts we can bring to the people we care for and the entire world."

The following well-known expression from St. Teresa of Avila applies to the one who evangelizes too, "A sad saint is a bad saint." But this idea is older than St. Teresa of Avila. It has roots in the words of St. Paul, "Rejoice in the Lord always. I shall say it again: rejoice! Your kindness should be known to all. The Lord is near." (Phil 4:4-5)

But it has further roots. It began with the early Church's encounter with the Risen Christ, the foundation of our faith: the women who departed from the tomb "with great joy" (Mt 28:8) or the Disciples at Emmaus whose "hearts were burning within us while he spoke to us on the way and opened the scriptures to us." (Lk 24:32).

The Holy Father reminds us, "Christians have the duty to proclaim the Gospel without excluding anyone." These aren't new obligations – they appear in people who wish to share their joy, who point to a horizon of beauty and who invite others to a delicious banquet. Besides practicing with joy, during the corporal and spiritual deeds of mercy this year (see below), you are strongly encouraged to invite someone to the most joyful and solemn celebration of the Liturgical year: the Easter Vigil.

The Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy are charitable actions by which we come to the aid of our neighbor in his spiritual and bodily necessities. Especially during this time of Lent, our acts of love through sacrifice and prayer are a tangible witness of God's love to those around us.

- Counsel the Doubtful (Spiritual): Invite a friend to come to Youth Group, Mass, or a retreat with you. Read the book (and/or share it) <u>Rediscovering</u> <u>Catholicism</u> by Matthew Kelly, if you or someone you know are questioning your/their faith.
- Give Alms to the Poor (Corporal): As a family, decide to decrease or give up the use of a luxury, putting what is saved into a Mercy Jar—then, as a family, decide to which charity to donate the saved money.
