In 1984, welcoming hundreds of thousands of young people to the Vatican for a special Palm Sunday celebration, he launched what has become the most significant internal gathering on the church's calendar: World Youth Day.

Chalice Ceremony – PGK Richard P. Owen



Fr. Malloy Assembly, #1894, conducted a Chalice Ceremony in honor of Richard P Owen, PGK, PFN, FDD, on January 29, 2020. The reverent ceremony was held in Providence Hall in Fairfax, VA—a place where Brother Richard spent many days supporting the Knights, the community and answering God’s call. An engraved chalice with Richard’s name was presented to his widow, Geri Owen. Shortly the chalice will be delivered to a parish in the Philippines—then, every time Holy Mass is said, the priest remembers Brother Richard in his prayers. May we always keep him, Geri, and their family in our prayers.

New 1st, 2nd, and 3rd Degree Exemplification Ceremony:

Rooted in Past, Tailored for Present-- At the State Deputy meeting in November 2019, Supreme Knight Carl Anderson announced a historic moment for the Order — the introduction of a new and groundbreaking combined exemplification ceremony, highlighting the principles of charity, unity and fraternity. Here are excerpts from his speech.



Why the change?

“In recent decades, we have found it harder to bring men, especially young fathers, into the Order. When we ask them why, they tell us three ceremonies are too time-consuming and too difficult to attend. They tell us that secrecy is unnecessary.”

“Many local councils lack ceremonial teams or the manpower to organize degrees. This means many candidates wait far too long to fully join our ranks. Some give up. Too many never take their Second and Third Degrees. Last year, only little more than half of the men who took their First Degree also took their Third Degree.”

How the change came about

“Our most recent supreme convention adopted a resolution from Illinois to consider combining our current First, Second- and Third-Degree ceremonies into one and removing the condition of secrecy. . . . We undertook an inclusive process with supreme directors, state officers and ceremonialists with many decades of experience in the exemplification of our degrees.”

Inspiring a new generation

“Just as our forefathers rallied to meet the challenges of their day, we must inspire the men of our day. We must reach out to meet these men where they are. And when we do, we must show them that they are called to be men of Charity, Unity and Fraternity. Because of this we are acting to make our Order more inviting and more accessible.”

“We must forge a new generation of Knights — men who see in our principles of charity, unity and fraternity a path to leading a Catholic way of life that can strengthen their families, their parishes and their communities. We must reach a new generation of men by the witness of our charity, our brotherhood and our ceremonials.”

The new exemplification

“This new ceremonial is rooted in our past and tailored to our present. It will inspire more men to join us. Most of all, it will empower the Knights of Columbus to advance our mission and grow in the years ahead.”

“Instead of having separate ceremonies, all three degrees can now be conferred in a single ceremony. The new exemplification focuses on the history and principles of our Order. It presents a fuller and richer understanding of who we are, what we stand for and what we are called to be. It hearkens back to the simple ceremonies of Unity and Charity first approved by Father McGivney. Our new ceremony can be held in a council chamber or in the parish with families and friends seated in the pews. They will see firsthand, the organization that their husbands, fathers, brothers, sons and friends are joining — the principles and values they are committing to and why it matters.”

Council 4522 is working with District 15 Deputy and PGK, John Knox, to establish a new Exemplification Team and/or join other teams within the District so our new incoming members can usher into the Order as soon as possible. Supreme Chaplain Archbishop William E. Lori’s Monthly Challenge

“You are the salt of the earth. But if salt loses its taste, with what can it be seasoned? It is no longer good for anything but to be thrown out and trampled underfoot.” (Gospel for Feb. 9, Mt 5:13)

Imagine that you’re at a steakhouse, and your plate finally arrives. Then, just as you are looking for the salt, you learn that the restaurant has completely run out of it. It’s easy to see that without salt, our food can be bland and tasteless. Turning to the words of our Lord, has your life of faith become bland and insipid? Jesus did not die for our sake in order that we might offer the world a mediocre reflection of his life. As we embark on our Lenten journey, may we strive to be men who season the world and our communities with the salt of an authentic and inspiring Christian life.

This month, I challenge you to sharpen your Christian witness by saying grace before meals at home and in public. Second, as you begin your Lenten journey, I challenge you to develop your “saltiness” through spiritual reflection, either with the Faith in Action Spiritual Reflection program or on a more informal basis.

NOVENA for Life, March 16th – March 25th

The protection of life is a sustained prayer intention of the Church, and of the Knights of Columbus. Knights remain firmly committed to defending the right to life of every human being – from the moment of conception to natural death. To commemorate and bolster this important cause, Council 4522 is promoting a novena, nine days of sustained prayer, to build up a culture of life in our parishes, homes and wider community. The Life and Times of St. John Paul II...con't

In America, we are not familiar with the Catholic term "Primate," but as it relates to the elevation of Karol Woytla to Archbishop of Krakow.

The term Primate refers to a canonical administrator over an extra diocesan geographical area, usually a metropolitan area. While some bishops still hold this title, in modernity, it no longer has any additional function above that of the bishop's normal assignment.

At the time of Wotyla's elevation to Archbishop, the Primate of Poland was Primate Wysniewski. His position was important as a deal existed between the Primate and the Communist government that senior church positions had to be mutually agreed upon by both parties. This effectively gave the Communist government a veto over future Church leadership in Poland. The post of Archbishop of Krakow had been vacant for some time because the Church and State could not find a mutually agreeable candidate.

The circumstances and story of how Bishop Wotyla managed this role will be the subject of our lecture next meeting.
