Isn't that good advice for all of us...no matter what the path?

TOWARD A MISSIONARY FAMILY: MAY'S TOPIC – REDISCOVERING THE ROSARY

When St. John Paul II visited New York in 1995, he recommended one prayer to families: "the Rosary, and especially the Joyful Mysteries, which help us to meditate on the Holy Family of Nazareth." The Rosary is a treasure to be rediscovered, a life-changing prayer. St. John Paul II was sure that if the American family discovers the Rosary, divorce and abortion will be defeated, and the Catholic family will become a beacon of hope and joy.

In the Rosary we contemplate the life of Jesus with the eyes of Mary. We see Christ in the womb of Mary, a newborn in Bethlehem, and flying to Egypt; working in Nazareth, preaching the Gospel, and suffering for us; finally, we discover him risen and victorious. When we pray the Rosary, we become disciples of the heart of Mary. She teaches us become like Jesus.

During May, the month of Mary, we are invited to pray the Rosary with our family. It is good to pray the rosary alone, but it is even better to pray it with our spouse, our children, or even with our neighbors. When we pray together we stay together. Why? When we spend time together looking at Jesus Christ, we remember the source of our love and our companion in our family journey. We are not alone, Mary helps us to look at Jesus Christ.

Mary is the first missionary because she taught St. John and the apostles after the resurrection how to contemplate and learn Christ. Through the Rosary, Mary also teaches us not only to learn, but to be conformed to Christ. And so, learning Christ and being one with him moves us to proclaim Christ through Mary, making us missionaries like her.

St. John Paul II was right. We need to rediscover the untapped power of the Rosary. Mary helps us to look at each other with different eyes, with the eyes of Christ: eyes of forgiveness, gratitude, and joy.

The Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy

Admonish the Sinners (Spiritual)

- Pray the rosary (or a decade) for someone who is in need of God's mercy and forgiveness.
- When a family member or neighbor is in need of correction, pray for the courage and grace to speak with love and mercy.
- · Give drink to the thirsty (Corporal).
- · Share your faith story with someone else.

Guests were greeted with light appetizers, liquid refreshments, some Sunday afternoon jazz and time to share stories—between Knights of 50+ years of service, to those just joining the Order.

Our Council Chaplain, SK Fr. Leopoldo Vives, offered an opening prayer, "Prayer for the Intercession of Saint John Paul II," which in the form of a prayer card was provided to every guest, and the party was underway. Catered by "Glory Days Grill," Knights and their family and friends dined on an array of wonderful food. The event garnered dignitaries throughout the

Order, including keynote speaker, Worthy State Deputy Stephen Kehoe, Past State Deputy and current Worthy Executive Secretary Cy Alba, Supreme Director Tom Harger, Worthy District Deputy Joel Levesque and Worthy District Warden Pat McGuire.

The Council has a long list to thank for the success of the event, starting with the Planning Committee chaired by SK Edward White. Ed's committee included, Sandy Stone, Vincent Apostolico, Dennis Brown, Roger Williams, Ron Plavchan, and members of the Casey Women's Club, Connie King and Marion Scaffadi. The Casey Women's Club also stepped up and provided all of the decorations and dessertsincluding the beautiful cake for the event. Many thanks also to Ron Plavchan, PGK, PFN, FDD for his outstanding contribution—capturing the history of the Council, which was included in part in the Celebration Program. Fr. Juan Espino provided a plethora of support from initial overall guidance in event planning to soliciting and providing manpower before, during and after the event. Other contributors included Brother Dave Cook, Ms. Susan Gray, Queen of Apostles school staff, the Poor Sisters of St. Joseph and the family of Brother Knights that helped set up and clean up the gym, led by our Worthy Warden, Joe King.

Thank each one of you for your support. Without the contributions from everyone, the event would have never happened. God Bless you all!

FINANCIAL ANALYSIS OF THE COUNCIL

We are no exception to the typical budget pressures realized in most organizations, and our financial situation comes to light several times each fraternal year. The complications begin in May, when we approve the "budget" for the next financial year, which begins on July 1st. They arise again in January and February, after we send out the annual dues notices (and don't receive dues from the members in a timely fashion). Lastly, issues resurface in April the following year, as we review the past year's performance, while formulating the "budget" for the next fraternal year.

There are many variables in determining our budget—some we control, some we cannot control. The Council's main source of income is through

membership dues—currently \$48 per year, with an additional \$3 voluntary (but strongly encouraged) donation to help offset mandatory expenses. Seems somewhat straight-forward, but it's not. We have

228 Total Knights = 91 Insurance (only) + 137 associate. Included in those numbers are: 27 Inactive Knights, 4 Honorary, and 74 Honorary Life members.

So, one would think, $$51 \times 228 = $11,628$ or even \$10,944 if no one elected to pay the voluntary \$. But no. Per Supreme guidance: Honorary Life members pay \$0, Honorary members pay no more than \$12, Inactive Knights pay \$0. So what you have is 137 Knights less a number of Honorary or Honorary Life members footing the bill for the entire Council or in the case of the 2018/2019 budget...a whopping \$4,300...IF everyone pays their dues.

On that note, each year we have several Knights tracking down as many as 50-60 Knights in January-April trying to get them to pay their dues—some of which are reading this newsletter right now—which is a benefit to all members—and paid for through the annual dues. It is a very time consuming, stressful, and completely unnecessary function each year, which takes valuable Knight hours away from doing all the things we are supposed to be doing...charity, works of mercy, etc. and those dues are our lifeline.

The financial picture gets bleaker when we look at the mandatory fees the Council must pay the Virginia State Council and Supreme each year. The Council must pay Supreme each year:

\$3.50 a year for all members, minus honorary life, or $228 - 74 = 154 \times 3.50 = (\$539)$

\$1.00 a year for all members, minus honorary life, or $228 - 74 = 154 \times 1.00 = (\$154)$ (Catholic Advertising) \$2.00 a year for all members, minus honorary life or $228 - 74 = 154 \times 2.00 = (\$308)$

We also pay Virginia State Council each year: \$4.00 a year for all members, minus honorary life, or $228 - 74 = 154 \times 4.00 = ($616)$; add to that \$150 a year for support of State meetings = (\$150).

In total, that is nearly \$1,800 the Council MUST pay, whether or not the members pay their dues. In context...we are currently tracking down nearly \$3,000

in unpaid dues...plus the \$1,800 mandatory fees and you're looking at \$4,800. Remember, the budget for income from dues was only \$4,300 to begin. So, we start the year off at a \$500 deficit.

What's the answer(s)? For one, Knights need to pay their dues...ON TIME. Its part of the oath during the 1st Degree. Secondly, Knights need to step forward with ideas AND manpower to hold fundraising events. Its not good enough to say, "We need to do a pancake breakfast or spaghetti dinner." The "we" needs to take the bull by the horns and lead that effort from start to finish. The help is there....it just needs to be planned and executed. And third, we need to recruit new Knights! Not only will they bring a new energy to the Council, if we meet Supreme's "quota" for the year—all those "mandatory" fees go away!

Just this past year alone, if the Council netted 15 new Knights, there would not be \$1,000 in mandatory fees imposed, plus we'd have roughly \$765 in extra dues. Thus, instead of a \$500 deficit, there would be a \$1,300 surplus, not to mention the additional good Catholic gentlemen added to the Order.

It may seem confusing, but its not. Pay your dues...on time. Recruit ONE new member a year and give something back. No matter what your personal situation, there is someone in greater need, and with the assistance of your Brother Knights, we can improve that person's situation.
