Grand Knight's Message

In this month of May, the annual State Council meeting (convention) will be held. Due to the pandemic crisis, the meeting will be held virtually on Saturday May 1, 2021. On Saturday, May 9, 2021, the second most celebrated day will be held—Mother's Day. We, as Catholic gentlemen, need to honor our mothers and spouses. Some of us will offer prayers for the souls of our mothers because they are no longer with us. Maybe you would consider taking your mother to lunch on this day—better yet, making her lunch or dinner!

I received notice from the Supreme office congratulating our council for earning the Columbian Award for the 2020-2021 fraternal year. The award was possible despite the few active participants who participate in various activities in the parish and community. Supreme also informed me that we are one step closer to receiving the Star Council Award. The Star Council Award recognizes outstanding achievement in membership, insurance, programming, and overall operations. We are also in line to earn a State Deputy Award for the Commonwealth of Virginia Council.

I am not a doctor and don't claim to be one, but I am encouraging every member of Pope John Paul II Council 4522 to please sign up to get vaccinated. Being vaccinated might allow us to gather in June and in other months to come. We owe it to ourselves to stay safe and be healthy and the vaccination could do it. As Catholic gentlemen, it is always up to us to protect our loved ones. Please my brothers, everyone who wants to get vaccinated can get one, but you must sign up and schedule an appointment. Please allow me to use this framework to ask you to consider serving in one of the many ministries in our parish, Queen of Apostles. You are not only inviting a brother, but you could also be inviting an entire family. Consider it!

My term as the Grand Knight is coming to an end. I want to suggest to our Council to purposefully focus the 2021/2022 fraternal year on Faith in Action-Life. It is a higher purpose program. You can change hearts and minds about abortion by showing that the Knights of Columbus love both mother and child before and after birth (Fraternal Leadership Advisory, April 2021). Council 4522 should consider saving lives by helping women choose life by giving them the opportunity to view their unborn children on ultrasound machines at pro-life pregnancy centers. The cost of one machine is high, so the Council can advocate for the district to come together to work on one common goal of purchasing one machine. When you raise half the cost, Supreme can support the district with the other half. Or the Council may assist a pregnancy center with the cost of their insurance for six months to one year. Alternatively, the council may explore the cost of servicing an ultrasound machine for three months to a year. I know Council 4522 can handle any project it

Happy Easter!

Happy Easter again to each one of you! It may seem odd to use this greeting almost a month after the feast has passed, but as Christians, we know that the Easter season of celebration and rejoicing lasts far longer than any other season of the year, a full ten days longer than Lent! What's more, since Christ is forever risen from the dead, from the day of the first Easter until now, it is, in a sense, always Easter for us. So then, it is imperative for us to live out that joy in concrete ways throughout our whole lives, and more specifically during this most sacred season. Lent might have a different emphasis, and call us to acts of self-denial or fasting, but Easter calls us to action no less, this time, however in acts of faith, hope, and charity. I would suggest that during this Easter season, we look for opportunities to practice encouragement, and mercv.

While we might view encouragement as simply the kind act of a decent person when they find someone in distress, this sort of love when practiced in a Christian way perfectly encapsulates the mission of Easter. All of us live in a fallen world, surrounded by uncertainties, difficulties, and trials, and carrying within us fears and hurts. Thus for every soul, discouragement is always nearby. I could say all the more so in a time when so much in society seems chaotic, difficult, or disappointing, but the truth is that this has always been so, throughout history. We all need to receive constant reminders of Christ's victory over sin, death, and all evil, to keep the courage necessary for living a Christian life, and so, since we control only our own actions, we ought to respond to this need by giving those reminders ourselves, especially to those who are already struggling with doubt or discouragement. To lift another soul with the good news of Christ's triumph is to give that person a share in and access to the Resurrection, while also strengthening our own hearts. We would do well to resolve giving at least one encouragement a day new durina sacred time of this life

The other truly Christian discipline we are called to take up in the Easter season is that of mercy. Christ, because He has conquered sin, and emerged living and glorious from carrying the wounds of our misdeeds, is able to be absurdly generous in His forgiveness, even forgiving His Apostles, who abandoned Him the night He was taken away to be killed. He does not accuse or reject them, despite how much they certainly hurt Him, but rather forgives their sins and calls them to a new life of goodness along with Him. Christ can forgive this freely because He is strong in the love of the Father, and in His knowledge of eternal justice. We, who have access to everything that is Christ's through Baptism, can imitate Him most perfectly by also showing mercy, not as an act of weakness or surrender to earthly hurts, but as an act of trust and divine strength, knowing that the Father will, without any doubt, set all things right in the end. A resolution to forgive someone this Easter season, or show mercy to someone who needs it, even in the prayer of our hearts, would go a long way to honoring the days of Christ's glory.

If we undertake these two disciplines, encouragement and mercy, we will not only find that we have perhaps understood and lived the Easter season with greater clarity than ever before, but also that our hearts have grown to be more like that of our God and Lord Jesus Christ, which would be the finest Easter gift of all.

God bless you, and let's pray for each other!

St. Joseph as a Role Model for Knights

In late 2020, Pope Francis declared 2021 as the year of St. Joseph. The announcement came on the 150th anniversary of Blessed Pius IX declaring St. Joseph as Patron of the Catholic Church and on the feast of the Immaculate Conception of Mary, Joseph's spouse. Although Mary does not mention Joseph explicitly in scripture (she only refers to him after Jesus was lost and was found in the Temple: "Your father and I have been looking for you anxiously") he was her husband, and the man who experienced with her the events of family life. Through Mary, we learn that Joseph suffered in silence by accepting faith in God's plan, marrying a most pure wife and welcoming a divine adoptive child. He must have been a strong man, both physically and morally, to bear the demands that taking care of Mary and the child entailed: the mysterious pregnancy, the unexpected travels and their harshness, poverty, attacks from those in power, hard work, migration to an unknown land. As the pandemic slowly recedes, and many of us aim for a sense of normalcy and comfort, we must not forget about St. Joseph and his domestic love for others. As Pope Paul VI said in 1966, "Joseph made a total gift of himself, his life and his work, by making his human vocation of domestic love a total sacrifice of self, a sacrifice of his heart and of his full capability to love at the service the Messiah born under his care."

In Memory of Brother Richard Owen

As I sat down to start preparing articles for this month's Knightly News, I learned that our Lord had finally called his dutiful servant, Richard (Dick) Owen, home on Thursday, April 25, 2019. To say that Dick was an active member of Knights of Columbus Council 4522 for over 45 years—seems to slight

him. During that time, he faithfully served the Council, the Assembly and the Knights in numerous positions and Officer posts—starting as the Council photographer, then over the years serving as Council 4522's Grand Knight, Assembly 1894's Faithful Navigator and a Virginia State District Deputy. Brother Richard also held officer rolls in the Casey Club and Casey Foundation.

Brother Owen received several awards over the years for his unselfish work with charities, including the Robert D. Neary Award, presented by the State Knights of Columbus Charities in 1998. In 2009, he was awarded the nationally acclaimed Jefferson Award for public service and charitable activities in the community. He has also been recognized as Knight of the Year by the Council and the Assembly.

Richard deeply believed in the work and programs of the Knights of Columbus and was always willing to help the Officers of the Council and Assembly in any way he could. I feel truly honored that I was able to work along side and be taught by Brother Dick on the virtues and characteristics of being a Knight of Columbus. I know I have used this space many times to espouse the Venerable Fr. McGivney's vision—to change a man's *life; to deepen and enrich his faith; to strengthen his family*; and to build better lives for those who so desperately need help—to me, those were our dear Brother Richard's goals as well.

I personally hope I can continue to maintain Dick's standards, Dick's expectations, and his love for his fellow man. And let Richard Owen's journey to heaven, be a call to you—step up, get involved, help your fellow Brothers help others at every opportunity. Let's band together to ensure that the Council that Brother Richard helped build and maintain remains relevant to the Order and the State Council and a blessing to the community and parish we serve.

May we all pray for the repose of Brother Richard Owen's soul and that the Lord will indeed be merciful to Lady Geri, the entire Owen family, his friends and Brother Knights.
