40 Cans for 40 Days

Pope John Paul II Council 4522 again partnered with Queen of Apostles Catholic School to hold the Fifth Annual 40 Cans for 40 Days Campaign at the school. The Campaign offered the children (and their families) blessings each day during Lent—providing them with the opportunity to give alms, promote charity to others, and learn/know more about sacrifice in the way of

St. Joseph Icon Prayer Service



Jesus is Risen?

that truly the case? Is He really? How real is it for us that Christ has risen? How actually much are we like Thomas the apostle who would not believe what those closest to him were tellina him? How much more difficult for many of us-removed from Christ's physical



resurrection by nearly 2,000 years? It can be easy to reduce this event to a mental exercise akin to pondering mythology. Yet, the truth is that He did rise from the dead. As our Catechism says, "Although the Resurrection was an historical event that could be verified by the sign of the empty tomb and by the reality of the apostles' encounters with the risen Christ, still it remains at the very heart of the mystery of faith as something that transcends and surpasses history." Incredible. God—the mystical and transcendent spirit—inserted himself into history and appeared on Earth as a man.

But the whole thing can still seem so distant and so unreal: Jesus not only resurrected but as the resurrected Lord God himself. As we contemplate this mystery, let's look at what transpired in the days and years immediately afterwards. For myself, I go back to St. Thomas. Here he was—one of the original twelve apostles—yet he still would not believe. Only when he put his finger in Christ's wounds did he realize that not only had Jesus come back from the dead, but that he truly and undoubtedly was "my Lord and my God!" This fervor was not the passing excitement of witnessing a magical act. Infused with the Holy Spirit, Thomas went all the way to India to spread the gospel. This is 2,000 years ago. In this day and age of air travel and instantaneous communications, India is still considered exotic. What would possess a man to decide to go there during that time of Christ? Thomas wasn't a trader. He

wasn't seeking spices. He wasn't an explorer. Instead, something happened that took hold of his heart...something so powerful that it would compel him to travel to a distant land, without the language or much else, to preach about what he had experienced in meeting God himself. And the proof of Christ's presence with Thomas is evident today. Christianity was initially established in India because of Thomas. Because of God's presence, it endures to this day.

This behavior wasn't relegated just to Thomas. All the apostles went through extraordinary lengths to preach about God. Which of us today would voluntarily put ourselves in danger or in hostile situations to preach about our faith? These men and women experienced something so extraordinary that it made them travel to the known ends of the earth to talk about their encounter with the true and living God.

We are so blessed that we encounter Jesus in the Eucharist. In the Eucharist resides the true presence of the Lord our God. Again – it's so hard to believe. But He is indeed there. Let us never forget that and always revere the presence of Jesus in our midst. It can be easy to take His presence for granted. Lord, help me in my unbelief! Christ is risen!!!
