



As I sat down to start preparing articles for this month's Knightly News, I learned that our Lord had finally called his dutiful servant, Richard (Dick) Owen, home on Thursday, April 25, 2019. To say that Dick was an active member of Knights of Columbus Council 4522

for over 45 years—seems to slight him. During that time, he faithfully served the Council, the Assembly and the Knights in numerous positions and Officer posts—starting as the Council photographer, then over the years serving as Council 4522's Grand Knight, Assembly 1894's Faithful Navigator and a Virginia State District Deputy. Brother Richard also held officer rolls in the Casey Club and Casey Foundation.

Brother Owen received several awards over the years for his unselfish work with charities, including the Robert D. Neary Award, presented by the State Knights of Columbus Charities in 1998. In 2009, he was awarded the nationally acclaimed Jefferson Award for public service and charitable activities in the community. He has also been recognized as Knight of the Year by the Council and the Assembly.

Richard deeply believed in the work and programs of the Knights of Columbus and was always willing to help the Officers of the Council and Assembly in any way he

could. I feel truly honored that I was able to work alongside and be taught by Brother Dick on the virtues and characteristics of being a Knight of Columbus. I know I have used this space many times to espouse the Venerable Fr. McGivney's vision—to *change a man's life; to deepen and enrich his faith; to strengthen his family; and to build better lives for those who so desperately need help*—to me, those were our dear Brother Richard's goals as well.

I personally hope I can continue to maintain Dick's standards, Dick's expectations, and his love for his fellow man. And let Richard Owen's journey to heaven, be a call to you—step up, get involved, help your fellow Brothers help others at every opportunity. Let's band together to ensure that the Council that Brother Richard helped build and maintain remains relevant to the Order and the State Council and a blessing to the community and parish we serve.

Holy Thursday - Foot Washing



Jesus Christ. The Word Incarnate. The Word made Flesh. Imagine spending time with Jesus while he was physically on earth - the same Jesus who cast out demons, who gave sight to blind me, who flipped over tables in the temple, and walked on water. He is the same Jesus that we venerate at Mass and in the Eucharist. Jesus was a man - human just like us.

One can only imagine what it must have been like to eat with Jesus, discuss things with him, and simply have

down time with him - to be part of the greatest team with the greatest leader. A leader who loved (and still loves) others tremendously regardless of race, creed, appearance, or circumstance. Jesus came to serve us, love us, and most importantly save us.

On Holy Thursday, 12 of our Knights stepped up to have their feet washed during the mass by Fr. Ignacio de Ribera. By having their feet washed, it brought them back in time to when Jesus first washed the feet of his own disciples—not long before he was to be publicly tortured and executed. Jesus knelt down to wash the feet of Judas Iscariot, the disciple who would betray him. Symbolically, it was a beautiful experience because it reminded us firsthand of the character of Jesus – a humble and meek leader who loved and accepted people from all walks of life, including people like Judas.

Even within the group of Knights that had their feet washed, diversity in nationality, age, background, and occupation were clear and it was the perfect reminder of how "... God so loved the world, as to give his only begotten Son; that whosoever believeth in him, may not perish, but may have life everlasting." (John 3:16) because "Greater love has no one than this: to lay down one's life for one's friends" (John 15:13).

40 Cans for 40 Days – Huge Success!



Showcasing businesses, schools, scouts, veterans, charitable organizations, international dance groups, marching bands, Step Teams, and those just out to enjoy the day, the Annandale Parade will once again be celebrated on Saturday, October 28th from 10:00 AM to Noon along Columbia Pike. The Annual Parade promotes community involvement and neighborhood camaraderie while celebrating the rich diversity of Annandale. It's also just a great way to have a bit of innocent family fun. Mark your calendar, plan to participate in the parade itself or bring the family to view this Annandale tradition. Children are invited to wear their Halloween costumes, to cheer the participants, and to marvel at the exhibits.



The Annandale Chamber of Commerce, sponsor of the parade, is pleased to announce that this year's Grand Marshal is Richard Owen, Vice President of the Casey Club-Knights of Columbus and a recipient of the prestigious Jefferson Awards for Public Service. The Jefferson Awards encourage and honor individuals for their achievements and contributions through public and community service. Richard was particularly excited to receive the Jacqueline Kennedy Onassis award for outstanding public service for organizing a group that has prepared over 400 meals for the needy, and for raising over \$11.7 million for KOVAR, a Knights of Columbus charitable program that provides financial support to organizations that offer training and help to those with intellectual disabilities. Past winners include Hubert Humphrey, Madeleine Albright and Henry Kissinger. For years, Richard has also gathered a team of his fellow Knights and neighbors to pick-up multiple vehicles full of donated bread and baked goods from a commercial bakery in Woodbridge and deliver these weekly donations to a number of shelters, ACCA, and local food pantries in both Annandale and Bailey's Crossroads. He has also collected and carted donated books, videos, television sets, playing cards and board games to VA hospitals and other veteran organizations annually. Richard has volunteered regularly at the Annandale Parade, the Fall Festival, the Bed Race, Annandale's National Night Out and promoted charitable causes and volunteerism in our community. A quiet spoken, thoughtful gentleman, Richard brings joy to every activity.

The Chamber is honored to have Mr. Owen as this year's Grand Marshal and treasure him as a member of the Annandale Community. While we honor Richard, the Chamber would also like to herald the Knights of Columbus for their ongoing dedication to community service, their many charitable endeavors, and the volunteer hours given annually by their membership. Most people have no idea the depth of their giving as this is an organization that truly exemplifies that charity asks for no recognition. This once, we hope they will accept our community's gratitude.

Casey Women's Club

As a lifetime member of the Catholic Daughters of America, and while serving as the Grand-Regent of Court Kavanaugh #54, she proudly was the first woman to lay a wreath on J.F. Kennedy's gravesite. Marion was honored to be a member of the Daughters of the Confederacy Mary Custis Lee - 17th VA Regiment, Chapter 7 and of the Daughters of the American Revolution. May she rest in peace.
