Grand Knight's Message

This is an extraordinary time in our lives and that of the Catholic Church. For the first time in my lifetime even St. Peter's Square was quiet on Palm Sunday and Easter Sunday. Despite the enormous crisis hovering over the world, Catholic Priests, Bishops, the Pope and Reverend Sisters continue to do the work of God and the church. They hold prayers and Masses for the Catholic communities that anyone can stream. My family and I Sunday after Sunday, get dressed and attend Mass in front of the television via EWTN. It was amazing to virtually witness the blessing of the Palms at the Basilica, but no one to pick them up. I observed the Easter Virgil Mass without observing Baptism, confirmations, and the welcoming of new Catholic members yet, the church stands strong and open.

In our Parish, Fr. Juan and all other priests, continue to hold daily confessions outside, Thursday adorations, daily masses and prayers for the Queen of Apostles community. They never tired serving through the Lenten period and even now in the Easter season. To these my brothers, I know we do our part in prayers, but we can do more to continue to support our parish and all parishes. We still have or receive our monthly envelopes—we need to use them to drop off checks or choose to make our offerings online from the comfort of our home. We must find a way to support the priest and the parish. The pandemic must stop you from being a practicing Catholic.

We were fortunate under the coordination of Worthy Financial Secretary, Roger Williams to have two young Catholic gentlemen participate. My brothers please join me in welcoming brother Knights Daniel and Martin, our newest 3rd degree Knights. Although we may not be able to meet them face-to face at this time, we may be able to meet virtually during next month's general membership meeting.

Less I forget, I would like to remind you my brothers that the opportunity to elect new officers of Council 4522 is fast approaching. All offices are open to be filled. 2020/2021 Council and Casey Club Nominations/Election Information

This from Supreme

The election of specified Knights of Columbus council officers is outlined in the Laws of the Knights of Columbus. Additional rules and procedures governing officer elections are found in each council's By-Laws and in the parliamentary procedures set forth in Robert's Rules of Order.

On March 13, 2020, in response to the Coronavirus pandemic, the Knights of Columbus Supreme Council issued guidance suspending in-person events and ceased all face-to-face contact. With these emergency restrictions in place, the Supreme Council temporarily authorizes councils to conduct necessary business by holding electronic meetings and conducting voting using any number of tools (e.g., Skype, Google Groups, other teleconference services, or mail).

As a result of the current public health emergency, there is a necessity to conduct officer elections in an alternative manner. As in any election, it is critical to establish procedures that will preserve secret balloting and ensure an accurate vote count. Therefore, Council 4522 will elect officers via an electronic meeting. The rules and procedures of the meeting will be the same as a regular, in-person council meeting, which includes the following steps: 1) The Nominating Committee will present a slate of candidates as prescribed by council by-laws. 2) Additional nominations may be made from the floor. 3) Voting will take place during the meeting—this will be accomplished via an online voting tool, such as Google Forms or Survey Monkey - TBD).

Election Date: Council 4522 will conduct its annual election of officers at a special virtual meeting at 7:30 p.m. on Wednesday, May 27, 2020. At this meeting, the only item for consideration and action will be the election of officers for the Council and the Casey Club. Five ways to lead your family in faith

While public masses are suspended, the activities that are normally part of our local parish are gone. But Jesus' call for us as Christian families — to serve as domestic churches in teaching the faith, growing in virtue, and evangelization — still exists. So how do families start? By following the five steps below, Knights can become true leaders of their domestic churches, not just during this time of pandemic but for their entire lives.

1. Start and end the day in prayer

Every good thing starts and ends in prayer. That is why every Knight should start every morning leading his family in prayer and end every night in the same way. Because of our special devotion to Mary, Knights should also regularly lead their families in praying the rosary together. 2. Schedule time together, as a family

Quality time spent together as a family is essential to a strong domestic church. But, these days, with so much time spent inside under "stay-in-place" orders, it's easy to mistake time *near* each other with time *with* each other. That's why it's important to plan time together as a family — a family dinner, for example, is an excellent start. Consider also planning a family movie night or a family prayer night! Just as important is quality time with your spouse. Carve out time every day, even if just five minutes, for praying together as a couple.

3. Keep holy reminders

There are a lot of mundane tasks that occur in our homes but even during chores, schoolwork or working from home, we are called to bring our faith into everything we do. One easy way to make sure we do not forget God and prayer in our daily lives is to keep a "holy reminder" in sight. Whether a prayer card, an image of the Blessed Mother or a cross, these objects serve as a reminder to refocus on our Lord and keep a spirit of prayer throughout the day.

4. Make an act of charity

There's a lot that families are sacrificing right now, but these sacrifices have the power to help those in need. Invite your family to come together and decide how to use funds you would otherwise use on going to the movies, eating at a restaurant or other events restricted by social distancing. If you have the means, consider using these funds to support your local parish, contributing to the <u>Leave No Neighbor</u> <u>Behind Fund https://www.kofc.org/en/news-room/leave-no-neighbor-behind/index.html</u> or another charity.

5. Lead in hope

Faith without hope is sure to be short-lived, and in this time of uncertainty and loss it can be easy to fall into hopelessness. As Knights, we are called to remember the hope offered us by the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ — especially in this Easter season. As heads of their domestic church, Knights are constantly called to share this hope of faith with their families. The Life of St. John Paul II

In 1964, Polish Primate Wyszynski appointed Karol Wojtyla the archbishop of Krakow with the approval of the communist government. Ever since the beginning of the 1960's the Polish government had made clear its desire for a second Polish Cardinal. Using typical communist "subtlety" in diplomacy, they were planning a divide and conquer strategy to split the Polish church. The decision to make Princes of the Church however fell exclusively to the Vatican with no need for consultation with the Polish communists.

The government simultaneously had their desires fulfilled and denied when in 1967, Pope Paul VI gave Karol Wojtyla his red Cardinal's cap. The Polish government already knew that they had been duped after Wojtyla 's appointment as archbishop, so he would have been their last choice for a second Polish Cardinal. Wojtyla and Primate Wyszynski ended up moving forward largely in unison, with Wojtyla deferring to Wyszynski whenever possible. All this despite the fact that Wyszynski once described Wojtyla, perhaps dismissively, as "a poet".


After the beginning of the second Vatican Council, Pope Paul VI started new policy of dealing with the communist governments of the world, which could be roughly described as "saving what can be saved". The thought behind this diplomatic strategy was that the church could not prevail or administer to the flock without existing to administer the sacraments. This is precisely what happened in Czechoslovakia where the church was so antagonistic to the government, that after the 1968 Soviet invasion, they effectively ceased to exist. This set the stage for diplomatic friction between Warsaw and Rome.
