#### **The Truth About Christopher Columbus**

Our nation recently celebrated Columbus Day, but the celebration was not universal. Unfortunately, the holiday and Christopher Columbus have come under increasing attack during this time of cultural, social and historical reappraisal. We are in a hyper partisan time in the U.S, with tension and confrontation creeping into nearly every corner of our public lives. Once widely accepted as an American hero, Columbus has now become the latest iteration of historical heroes turned villains not receiving any benefit of analysis or contextualization.

Thirty statues of Columbus have been removed from communities in America and many states and localities have begun to celebrate indigenous people's day instead of Columbus Day. Unfortunately, this trend has become more about political convenience rather than one based on historical facts and accuracy. It's worth noting that we should recognize the contributions Native Americans have made to our country with a nationally recognized holiday. However, if we wanted to celebrate a day commemorating indigenous people and their culture, wouldn't we want to celebrate a day that's significant to them and not us? Why should we erase Christopher Columbus? He wasn't responsible for Wounded Knee, the Trail of Tears or any act of mass murder perpetuated upon Native Americans.

I recently watched the video about Columbus shared by the KofC ahead of Columbus Day. (I encourage all of you to watch it). Through a relatively objective lens, the short film talks about Columbus's voyage(s), as well as the cultural and historical climate that allowed Columbus to become an official American holiday in the late 19th century. Much of the holiday's recognition stems from the deep anti-Catholic and anti-immigrant

sentiment (specifically Italians) during that time. By demonstrating that Italians had been a critical part of this country's founding-- as important as George Washington, Thomas Jefferson or Abraham Lincoln-both Italian immigrants and naturalized Americans could see each other as Americans with a common identity, instead of two competing groups

To be fair, Columbus had faults and we should judge him for that. He made terrible miscalculations that created tragic consequences for the native groups he encountered. However, the blame assigned to him is incredibly disproportionate to the reality. He was an explorer and an amazing voyager. He sailed to two continents previously unknown and laid the foundation for the idea of one world and one human race, a critical element in Church teaching that led to the birth of organizations like the Knights of Columbus.

Statement from Virginia State Chaplain, BishopPaul S. Loverde on the Beatification of Father Michael J. McGivney

Worthy State Deputy Brian Ripple, Worthy State Officers, Worthy Associate State Chaplains (brothers to me in the priesthood), and all my Brother Knights, and each of your families,

For a goodly number of years, all of us in the Commonwealth of Virginia have united our prayers with those knights and families throughout our nation, with others in every country where the Order is present, and, no doubt, with still others beyond these – all praying for the beatification of our holy founder, Father Michael J. McGivney. On October 31, 2020, tomorrow, in fact, Pope Francis, represented at the solemn ceremony in Hartford, Connecticut, by Cardinal Joseph Tobin will proclaim Father McGivney as "Blessed Michael J. McGivney." The united response of all knights throughout the world, ours included, will be a joyous and thunderous "Thanks be to God!" We now pray that very soon a second miracle can be verified so our beloved Blessed Father McGivney can then be proclaimed a Saint.

Meanwhile, Blessed Michael McGivney stands before us, urging us to become even more his faithful sons within the Order, so that, supported within and by our individual family, and by the intercession of our holy founder, we will witness to charity, unity, and fraternity in "who we are" and in "what we accomplish."

Charity will be demonstrated as we continue to help "the neighbor", that is, anyone in need, especially during this continuing pandemic, for example, our initiative "Leave No Neighbor Behind", while also being mindful of our ongoing outreach to the persecuted in Syria and Lebanon, and to others still experiencing inhuman living conditions, the ravages of internal civil conflicts, and the devastating effects of natural disasters.

Our unity will be clearly evident as we defend the truths of our faith, including the defense of all innocent and vulnerable life from conception to natural death; the insistence on marriage as the union of a man and a woman, along with the strengthening of family life; the resistance to any and all attempts to reduce or to eliminate religious freedom as envisioned by the Founding Fathers of the nation; and all injustice, especially at this time, racism.

Our fraternity will be the external bond that keeps up supportive of one another in each Council in terms of our growth in faith, our efforts to form our individual family into a domestic church, and our tangible affirmation of our Holy Father, our bishops, and priests in their pastoral responsibilities, to name but several examples of this fraternity.

Blessed Michael McGivney will surely empower us to continue what he so zealously and untiringly brought into being: an Order of Catholic laymen, strong in their faith; supportive of their families in good times, in sickness, in death, and thereafter; and, loyal to the ideals on which their country was founded; Catholic laymen who witness with pride and by God's grace to charity, unity and fraternity – and also to patriotism.

In the novena proceeding the beatification of Blessed Michael McGivney, I have been praying for all my brother Knights and their families worldwide, but especially for you, my brother Knights in Virginia, united with your families.
