CRITICAL ACTION NEEDED

Developing the Newsletter content, designing that content and preparing it for printing is an arduous and time-consuming activity, especially on a monthly basis. The newsletter costs approximately \$2,000 a year to mail—that is nearly 20% of our annual expenses! That is \$2,000 that could be put to much more valuable efforts, if it were available.

The Council has a fiduciary duty to make sure the Newsletter is getting to the right people and that it is at least getting a glance, if not read completely. Given our limited resources and responsibility to those we serve, both in and outside of the Council, the follow action is required immediately:

If you are receiving this Newsletter by the USPS (in your mailbox) AND want to keep receiving it via the mail, then you must validate that desire by contacting the Grand Knight, Roger Williams at (703) 642-1744 or via email at sbrog11@yahoo.com and let him know that is your wish, NO LATER THAN, October 20, 2018. IF you provide an email response,

your address will be removed from the mailing distribution list and you will get future Newsletters via email (much faster, in full color). If you do not contact the Grand Knight, then your information will be removed from the mailing distribution list and this edition will be your LAST Newsletter...and no one wants to see that happen.


Knight of the Month

Defend Life - Always



We (Our Council and the Queen of Apostles parish) have the busiest abortion mill in the diocese; Landmark Towers, 101 S. Whiting St. Alexandria, VA

Knowing there is a problem is the first step—2,263 babies killed is a problem. 13 women have an abortion every day in the Arlington Diocese because they feel they have no other choice. That is a problem. Praying outside Landmark Towers raises awareness. It might eventually cause the abortion clinic to lose its' lease. Knights of Columbus have "helped" several other clinics lose their leases over the years. This one is next on our list! Please plan on joining us again on October 20th at 9:00 AM at Landmark Towers to pray the Rosary, to pray for the most vulnerable of all, the unborn. The Rosary is prayed there every third Saturday at 9:00 AM.

Killing her child is not a woman's only option and its never the best choice for her child! There *are* options! Catholic Charities can provide housing, medical care, help with food, utilities, transportation. Adoption is an option. Baby Safe Haven which allows babies to be left at the hospital after birth with no questions asked is an option. Only 7% of abortions are for Mothers who are younger than 18. Most women are 24 or older and have already had a previous child.

Building the Domestic Church – Becoming a Real Man of God

Each month, going forward, we will explore the Knights of Columbus' series, "Building the Domestic Church." Each month in the *Knightly News* we'll highlight parts of the series and follow up these printed words with a pertinent discussion at the general monthly meeting (so if you see something you would like to discuss further or be part of the continued "learning experience" you'll have to come to the Monthly Council Meeting—2nd Wednesdays @ 7:30 PM).

We continue our series discussing how men and women love differently. The ultimate vocation of man is the same as the calling of woman: to love as Christ loves, which means to give of oneself unselfishly to and for others. This type of life will allow one to be a true image of God and to grow into God's holy likeness. But while man and woman are both called to give of themselves to the other and to welcome the other's gift of self, how each does so vary. Cardinal Angelo Scola has phrased

it in this way: "Men receive love by giving love; women give love by receiving love." Give, receive—receive, give. It's a tad more complicated than it looks!

These truths about human love in general, and masculine love in particular are beautiful; but these insights need to be made practical. What does masculine love look like in practice? What are the virtues of genuine manly love? Let's look to Saint Joseph as an exemplary example! After all, he taught Jesus what it meant to be a man according to his human nature, so if God the Father considered him a good enough teacher and model for Jesus, then we can certainly consider him a "role model" as well. Saint Joseph's holy, masculine, virtuous life can be summarized under four titles: fatherhood, chaste love, obedience, and action.

Yes, you may think you know all about Saint Joseph, but how much have you really thought about it? Prayed about it? Do so between now and the monthly Council meeting on October 10th, then come and listen to our Worthy Lecturer fill in the details and lead the discussion as we all strive to become "A Real Man of God." CASEY WOMEN'S CLUB


