October - Month of the Rosary

The month of October is dedicated to the Holy Rosary. According to an account by fifteenth-century Dominican, Alan de la Roch, Mary appeared to St. Dominic in 1206 after he had been praying and doing severe penances because of his lack of success in combating the Albigensian heresy. Mary praised him for his valiant fight against the heretics and then gave him the Rosary as a mighty weapon, explained its uses and efficacy, and told him to preach it to others.

Since the prayers of the Rosary come from such excellent sources - from Our Lord Himself, from inspired Scripture, and from the Church — it is not surprising that the Rosary is so dear to our Blessed Mother and so powerful with heaven.

"Today, when dangers far greater than those of the ancient Turks threaten not only Christianity but all civilization, we are urged by our Blessed Mother to turn again to the Rosary for help. If men in sufficient numbers do this, and at the same time carry out the other conditions that she has laid down, we have the greater reason for confidence that we will be delivered from our dangers." -- Mary in our Life by Fr. Pope John Paul II Series

St. John Paul II was a notable devotee of the Rosary. He declared a "Year of the Rosary" from October 2002 to October 2003, during which he introduced the luminous mysteries to the tradition. Saint John Paul II reflected upon the luminous mysteries as well as the role of Mary in the church, and the Rosary at large in his letter Rosarium Virginis Mariae. Most of the church and world have focused on the introduction of these "new" mysteries, however a mystery cannot be new, it always has been and always will be a mystery absent Divine revelation. The luminous mysteries of the Rosary center around the public life of Jesus. The Gospel writers dedicated much of their writings to this portion of His life and much of the liturgical year centers around these events and Scriptures. The events of the sorrowful mysteries are well documented in all the Gospels and were witnessed by many immediately before Jesus' resurrection.



The joyful mysteries center around the incarnation of Our Lord. This time of Jesus' life is somewhat secretive. Three decades had passed before Jesus fulfilled his final purpose on earth, and more decades had passed before anyone chronicled the events in writing. The amount of information available and the number of followers from His birth to adolescence is limited. making these mysteries particularly Marian in character. It was during this time that Mary's bond with Jesus was strengthened as he relied upon her daily for teaching, nourishment, and comfort. This was a time where she would get to know him like no other human being could.

Between His birth and Passion. He delivered some of the richest teaching of the Gospels. The luminous mysteries begin with the start of Jesus' overt religious life as embodied by his baptism. This is an experience we all share with Christ, and it is how we too started our

religious lives in this world. Christ's first sign, the changing of water into wine at the wedding at Cana, performed with Mary's encouragement is a fitting mystery of light because it is the first of many signs meant to open the eyes of mankind to the Divine person of Jesus. The proclaiming of the Kingdom (the third mystery) encompasses all the ways Jesus revealed His knowledge of the Father to our hearts, minds, and souls through his teaching. The Transfiguration is the mystery most directly associated with light, as Jesus physically shows us the changes that we too can undergo if we are faithful servants of God. Lastly, the institution of the Eucharist embodies Jesus' continuing presence in this world, for our sake, after he has suffered death. resurrection, and ascension into heaven. Jesus is the light of the world, and through the Eucharist, he remains with us until the end of days.


