September is Life Insurance Awareness Month



It's the one month each year that the life insurance industry coordinates a campaign aimed at educating folks about the importance of life insurance and helping them

get the coverage they need. A recent survey from LIMRA (Life Insurance Marketing Research Association) found that only 59% of Americans own life insurance and about half of those are underinsured. So that means that 70% of the population either has no life insurance or has too little life insurance.

So, what does that have to do with the Knights? The historian, Christopher Kauffman, spent several years at the Supreme Office and at the Museum, researching the book that he wrote on the 100th anniversary of our founding. That book, <u>Faith and Fraternalism</u>, notes on page 13, "...he [Fr. McGivney] was deeply interested in pursuing the topic of a Catholic fraternal insurance society among groups of Catholic laymen of New Haven." Then on page 35 Mr. Kauffman goes on, "...he [Fr. McGivney again] spent his energy in promoting the insurance feature...his emphasis on business was his pastoral concern for the social and financial security of the family."

Blessed Fr. McGivney lived both the social and the financial *insecurity* of a desperate family, with the breadwinner suddenly taken, that had to be supported. He left the seminary to work and support his mother and siblings. He didn't want other Catholic families to find themselves in such a predicament. That, and uniting men of faith, was the impetus for establishing our Order. Everyone who joined in those first years was insured; that was part and parcel of being in the organization. Now every member has a choice, and every member should know what we do, and how we do it.

No one wants to buy life insurance, BUT everyone should want to buy what life insurance provides: no change in lifestyle for the survivors...in the house where they want to be. It'll pay for a daughter's wedding, a child's college education and much more. What does life insurance provide? Peace of mind, security, freedom from anxiety, a safeguard from the unknown.

- 2). For every two tickets purchased by an individual, you receive a free electronic ticket. You must go online to get your third ticket and cannot use a paper ticket as your free ticket. Go to www.footballsweeps.com/FREE to claim your free ticket.
- 3). This fundraiser is open to all individuals and is not limited to Knights. Your family, friends, acquaintances, all can participate. They will make great early Christmas, birthday, or gifts for any other occasion. If an individual purchases two tickets, they will get a third free by going online. If they purchase four tickets, they get 2 free tickets and so on.

A Note From Our Lecturer

As Brother Knights, our collective and personal lives are about so much more than Charity, Unity, Fraternity and Patriotism. It is also about our personal journeys of staying in Grace, Adoration, Praying the Holy Rosary, and regularly attending Holy Mass.

Today's reflection is about being fed by the love of our savior's sacred heart.

Fed by the Love of His Sacred Heart

On the day when Saint Margaret Mary, not being able to receive Communion because she was sick, told Jesus of her immense desire to receive him, Jesus said to her, "For you alone I would have instituted the sacrament of my love."

At the moment of receiving Communion, say to Jesus, "Jesus, I come to you because I am weak, because I am miserable, because I am a sinner. I come to you because I have so much need of you." What a beautiful preparation for Communion! Do not say to him, "I come to you because I am well prepared," but, "I come to you because I need you so much." It is an exclusive right of the weak and miserable to be able to pray this prayer, with even greater fervor: "I need you, and I am happy to be in such great need of your mercy"—a prayer which goes like an arrow straight to the depths of his infinitely merciful heart.

Let Mass be the center of your day. Everything must flow for you from your daily Mass, and everything must culminate in it. Your day, because you will have willed it, must be a thanksgiving for the Mass you attended that day and a preparation for the Mass you will attend the next day. That does not mean you should think all day about your morning Mass or that of the next day; it means that you will have said to Jesus, making these words your disposition of soul, "I want all my life to be centered on the altar of the Mass, to depend on it, and to culminate in it, to be a thanksgiving and a preparation for my daily Mass—all my life, all my days, all the beatings of my heart."

Be an apostle of holy Mass and Communion. Do everything possible to facilitate daily Communion. Invite children to communicate as often as possible. Think of Jesus' desire to descend into souls, of the happiness he finds there, of the eternal consequences for a single soul, to have received one more holy Communion during its passage on earth. Have an ardent desire for Jesus in the Host.




